Kresge Foundation	<a href="#">Challenge Grant Program</a>	Kresge Challenge Grants are highly competitive and are designed to strengthen institutions through challenge grants for capital projects (construction or renovation of facilities, purchase of real estate and conservation easement, more integrated equipment systems). To receive awarded funds, institutions must meet the challenge of raising a specified amount of money on their own.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Applying organization must have annual financial statements that have been prepared and certified by a certified public accountant (the auditor) in accordance with U.S. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) or Government Accounting Standards (GAS). The foundation does not accept compilations or reviews.</li> <li>- Must be experienced in delivering effective programs, have talented and motivated leadership and possess the ability to mobilize private resources to achieve sustainable transformation.</li> <li>- Colleges and universities that are fully accredited associate, baccalaureate and/or graduate degree-granting institutions may apply. (Two Canadian university libraries have won previously.)</li> </ul>	Recent grants range from between \$200,000 and \$750,000.	Applications accepted year round.

The Foundation's prime areas of interest are Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Northwestern Ontario.	Grants may not be made to individuals due to government regulations. Organizations which do not possess a registration number from Revenue Canada are also exempt. It is rare that the Foundation will consider a grant for deficit financing.	Past grants have ranged from \$200 to \$75,000.	Continuous. The foundation normally meets in June and December to review applications and suggests that applicants submit completed application forms well in advance.
